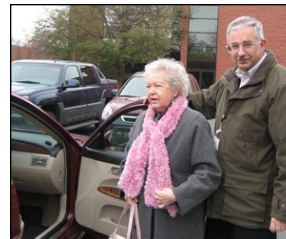

What Services Are Provided?
