**RE:** Resources for Establishing a Standing Affordable Housing Board or Committee or Council

A standing Affordable Housing Board or Committee can be a valuable resource to assist a municipality in assessing, implementing, and achieving its goals toward addressing Workforce Opportunity Housing and additional affordable housing goals. An Affordable Housing Board or Committee or Community Council includes a variety of community perspectives to provide for more robust discussions, enhanced problem-solving capabilities, and representative solutions that are likely to balance common interests.

Important perspectives include, but are not limited to:

- **♦ Planning, Zoning, or Planning and Zoning Commissioner,**
- **♦ Member of the municipality's legislative body,**
- **♦ Conservation Commission or Land Trust Representative,**
- **♦ Community Resident(s) At-Large, including both:** 
  - Homeowner,
  - Renter,
- **♦** Social Services Representative,
- ♦ Senior Services Representative (e.g., a member of a Commission for Elderly Services or Commission on Aging),
- **Output** Board of Education Representative,
- **♦** Health Services Representative,
- **♦** First-Responder Representative,
- ♦ Realtor,
- **♦** Residential builder,
- **♦** Faith-Based Organization Representative,
- **Other locally-relevant representation.**

The <u>Town of Washington</u>, <u>Connecticut has a sample ordinance to establish a Housing Commission</u> that can be used to establish a Board or Commission or serve as a starting point.
